Get a glimpse into the PRTF program!

Up to 90% of the youth served through KidsTLC's Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF) have a history of childhood trauma, abuse or neglect, as well as disrupted attachments. Most have multiple complex diagnoses and are admitted because of early relational challenges that have created emotional and behavioral instability. But there is hope, even for the most challenging cases!

KidsTLC uses a range of gold-standard treatments in our therapeutic work, including evidence-based powerhouse modalities like Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT), Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) and Motivational Interviewing.

Coupled with our relational- and trauma-focused philosophy of care, the internationally hailed Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP), we create a safe and empathetic environment for children and their families to heal.

Our comprehensive services include outpatient therapy, an Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) and medication management.

With a deep commitment to understanding each individual's unique needs, we work toward optimum well-being through individual, family and group therapies that tackle a wide range of challenges.

In the fall of 2023, the Lotus Clinics moved to an expansive new location just a few miles from our main campus, enhancing our ability to serve the community. "My therapist gave me a lot of help when I was sad and anxious. He helped me get along better with my friends and family, and now, I'm doing better in school, too."

Our dedicated, multi-disciplinary team of highly skilled professionals collaborates to understand each child's unique needs and craft tailored treatment plans that foster growth and independence.

Services include Applied Behavior
Analysis (ABA), behavioral support,
language and communication
therapy, social skills development,
parent training and pre-academic
and academic readiness—
empowering children as young as 18
months to reach their full potential.

More Community & Campus Happenings

Thriving Communities

The Thriving Communities program offers assistance in navigating the complexities of finding mental health care and daily living support. In 2023, 382 individuals found support through 1,013 program encounters. And more than 100 social media posts were published in Spanish to foster safety and strong family relationships among all members of our community.

Family Therapy

Our team provided more than 3,000 hours of family therapy and training across all KidsTLC programs in 2023. This includes nearly 800 hours of KidsTLC Cares (Caregiver Attitudes Reinforced with Education & Support) in person and online.

Rooted in Hope Capital Campaign

In the fourth year of our capital campaign, KidsTLC continued its commitment to use the funds to provide better facilities and vital service lines for children and families in need. Significant renovations were made to the newest building acquisition for psychiatric residential treatment, security systems improved and the playground resurfaced.

Other Updates

KidsTLC continued to expand its Holistic Wellness efforts for staff. Taking care of those who take care of our kids remains a top priority! By fostering a culture of well-being, we ensure our team feels supported, valued and empowered to provide the best care possible.


